CLS STUDENTS AWARDED WITH NATIONAL ACADEMIC RECOGNITION

For the 2017-2018 academic year, five students received the honor of being 2018 President's Award for Educational Excellence award recipients. This award has very specific eligibility requirements, including maintaining a grade point average of 90 or above throughout grades 3-5 or grades 6-8 and standardized test scores in math and/or reading at or above the 95th percentile nationally. Scholarship Fund Allows Students to Succeed

Former CLS Board Member, Dr. Hermine Saunders, has dedicated her life to education and serving the community. Dr. Saunders has met many individuals throughout her life that she credits the valuable life lessons learned.

One such individual, Amanda "Mandy" Kent, inspired Dr. Saunders to write a biography, "Mandy's Story." Mandy was born on May 7, 1976, with spina bifida. While Mandy's life ceased to exist at 37 years old, her spirit has since lived on! In Mandy's short life she achieved many things due to her persistence, love of education and faith in God. Even though she was suffering with a life-altering disease, Mandy refused to be defined by it. Spina bifida would not be her legacy! That was validated by her parents, Donna and Richard Kent.

In "Mandy's Story" Dr. Saunders highlights many of Mandy's accomplishments and her general desire to always go above and beyond anyone's expectations. According to the Kents this was a "way of life for Mandy". Even though Mandy's life was short, she was able to make a lasting impact on those around her, including those with disabilities, through her advocacy work.

When Dr. Saunders wanted to capture Mandy's life in a book, she never intended on doing so to make a profit. It was with her own money that she produced the book, which sells at the Carroll Lutheran Village Gift Shop and at Grace Lutheran. All proceeds collected from sales of "Mandy's Story" are donated to the CLS Scholarship Fund in Mandy's Name. This fund goes to help students in need of financial assistance, which allows them to afford the cost of a private education.

According to Dr. Saunders, Mandy's love for education was a strong reason in the dedication of her donation to CLS. It is the hope of CLS that all students live life like Mandy- with a sense of perseverance, love of education and dedication to their faith. Though Mandy passed away almost 5 years ago, her legacy lives on at CLS through the recipients of the scholarship fund. Funds donated to the scholarship fund in Mandy Kent's name have exceeded \$2,200.









PRINCIPAL GILBART SELECTED TO SPEAK AT WILSON READING SYSTEM NATIONAL TRAINING

Principal Mandy Gilbart recently spoke to all attendees at the Wilson Reading System national training for educators on July 9th in Boston, Mass. Mrs. Gilbart was joined by a former student, Nichole (Coley) Ross. Together they shared the story of how the Wilson Reading Program and the meeting between these two individuals built a life-long connection to learning. Their story began in 2014 when Coley started her 8th grade year as a new student to CLS.

In front of the audience of 300+ educators, Mrs. Gilbart and Coley shared that by implementing the Wilson Reading Program with fidelity, Coley went from being unable to read to actually reading for pure enjoyment. For Coley, this experience has been life-changing.

Mrs. Gilbart holds an Advanced Professional Certificate, as well as special education and reading teacher certifications, and distinction as a certified Wilson Dyslexia Practitioner.
