Johann Wolfgang von Goethe said, "Instruction does much, but encouragement everything." If he were alive today, he could be speaking about the daily experience of our students at CLS. While we offer a traditional curriculum perfectly balanced by modern technology, and that curriculum is taught by certified, talented teachers, instruction only goes so far. CLS STUDENTS AWARDED WITH NATIONAL ACADEMIC RECOGNITION

Four CLS students were recipients of the 2018-2019 President's Award for Educational Excellence. This prestigious award has very specific eligibility requirements, including maintaining a grade point average of 90 or above throughout grades 3-5 or grades 6-8 and standardized test scores in math and/or reading at or above the 95th percentile nationally. CARROLL LUTHERAN SCHOOL STUDENTS ACHIEVE ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

Each spring, students in grades 1, 3, 5, and 7 participate in standardized testing. CLS administers the TerraNova and the InView assessments to gauge students' academic achievement and their ability to learn. Results are shared with parents, but the data is also used internally as one lens through which to view our curriculum and instruction over time. Assessment data is reflective of students' effort and achievement, and all of our data is inclusive of students with IEP's or 504 Plans. So, our testing data represents our full school population.

Historically, CLS students have outperformed the bell curve of the national percentile ranking, and 2019 continued this trend. If our students were performing exactly average compared to their peers across the country, our school as a whole would achieve average scores at the 50th national percentile. However, CLS students outperformed that national average by a considerable margin!

CLS School Wide Math Average Score= 73rd national percentile

CLS School Wide Reading Average Score= 73rd national percentile

Beyond those amazing school wide scores, it is important to note that of the students who were assessed, 30% of them scored at or above the 90th percentile in math. And, 30% of our students scored at or above the 90th percentile in reading. That means that one third of our students scored in the top 10% in the country. These outstanding test scores reflect the excellent instruction, well rounded curriculum, and individualized attention that CLS provides to every student. Our students are truly receiving an exceptional education, and it shows in everything from their critical thinking and problem solving skills to their assessment data.
